Judges 21:25 ~ *In those days there was no king in Israel, and everyone did as he saw fit [what was right in his eyes].* The repeated statement closes the history of the Judges of Israel. It is the summary statement of the failure of Israel in this period of salvation history:

- Israel does what is "evil in the eyes of Yahweh" (Judg 2:11 and repeated seven times in chapters 3-16).
- Samson does what is "right in his eyes" (Judg 14:4).
- Everyone does what is "right in his eyes" (chapters 17-21).

In doing what each man saw was "right in his eyes," the Israelites were in direct violation of their covenant command to act "by doing what is good and right in the eyes of Yahweh your God" (Dt 12:28). Michal E. Hunt Copyright © 2013
