Each vision begins with the phrase kai *eidon* = *and I saw* (your translation may have other variations to conform to modern conventions of pleasing literary forms, however, the literal translation of each of these verses begins with "And I saw.")

Note: In Revelation 19:16 we seem to have 2 titles for Christ that John tells us is one "name." Is he telling us to add the words together? The gematria of "King of kings, Lord of lords" in Aramaic (leaving out the "and") adds up to 777. A trinity of perfection in contrast to the Beast's number 666 which will never achieve perfection.
